



The *Manual of Curatorship* is the first work of its kind to be produced in English and is the definitive statement on museum practice. The material for sixty-one chapters was commissioned from a wide range of specialist contributors and edited by the Editorial Board of the Museums Association.

The *Manual of Curatorship* examines, from a multidisciplinary perspective and from the viewpoint of the practising curator, the key functions assigned to museums; the management of, and research on, the collections they hold, and the presentation of those collections to the visiting public. Conservation and storage are dealt with on both subject and material bases, with the emphasis on sound curatorial care, the rise of the museum as a social institution and the way in which its ethical and philosophical foundations have developed.

A further section details the administration of museums and describes their relationships to other similar institutions, focusing in particular on the relationship between museums and their controlling bodies, personnel management, premises management (including security), financial management and legal aspects.

All museum and art gallery professional staff at all stages of their careers will find this book, with its extensive coverage and depth of treatment, of immense interest and benefit.


