ABOUT THE DEPARTMENT:

The Department of Textile Conservation is responsible for the preservation, conservation, technical study, and research of the Museum's collection of approximately 36,000 textiles. The

encyclopedic collection represents a broad range of textiles, including tapestries, carpets, embroideries, costumes, and three-dimensional accessories of all periods and cultures. The Department sets guidelines for the care, handling, display, and storage of the textiles and has played a vital role in the Met's initiative to create a dedicated facility for Integrated Pest Management (IPM) with a purpose-built freezer and pre-and post-treatment areas. The Department has a diverse and dynamic staff involved in the care of textiles from 12 different curatorial departments. The environment of the laboratory encourages discussion and collaboration with the conservators and the supporting staff in consultation with the Conservator in Charge.

GENERAL STATEMENT OF RESPONSIBILITIES & DUTIES:

The Department of Textile Conservation is entrusted with conserving extensive collections of tapestries in The Met Fifth Avenue and The Met Cloisters. The department's practice of tapestry conservation is unique in that it includes both preserving a long tradition of increasingly rare restoration skills and evolving conservation practices.

You will join a team working on Heroes Tapestries, a renowned series from around 1400. You will have an opportunity to participate in research that uses advanced imaging techniques and various tapestry conservation methods, including wet cleaning, dyeing for color matching, and developing a support system for long-term preservation.

Please include a statement of interest explaining why you are the right candidate for this role. This is an end-dated and part-time position requiring three days per week. Time frames will begin upon hire: 9 months.

PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES & DUTIES

- Participate in all phases of conservation work with the Heroes Tapestries, including condition check, examination, wet-cleaning, material preparation, dyeing yarns, conservation treatment, installation, and preventive conservation work in the galleries
- Perform conservation treatment on the tapestry following the plan developed by the team that incorporates various techniques to compensate for the losses and stabilize the structure of the tapestry, ranging from conservation stitching through spaced tabby weave to re-warping and re-weaving
- Participate in creating and organizing various types of documentation and conservation reports along the project's progress.
- Assist conservators with assigned tasks while maintaining regular communication with supervising staff and the Conservator in Charge during all phases of the project
- Other duties as assigned

REQUIREMENTS AND QUALIFICATIONS

- Masters degree from a recognized textile conservation training program, or someone with equivalent knowledge and work experience.
- 5 years of working experience with tapestries
- Knowledge and experience of tapestry conservation methodologies current in the field
- Meticulous attention to detail and excellent hands-on skills with textiles
- Basic photography and proficiency in using imaging programs for documentation
- Excellent written, verbal, and interpersonal communication skills
- Ability to work independently and as part of a team with productive feedback/criticism
- Experience of working for a museum (preferred)
